

## FAST FACTS

- ▶ UCAMA is a not for profit society devoted to the preservation of Ukrainian Canadian history and culture in Alberta.
- ▶ UCAMA has been a member of Museums Alberta for over 15 years.
- ▶ Over 80,000 Canadians of Ukrainian heritage in Edmonton can access their family history through UCAMA.

## Museum Collection

- ▶ The ethnographic collection consists of over 2,000 artifacts which include household items and textiles made by Ukrainian pioneers in Alberta.
- ▶ The ecclesiastical collection contains the bible of the first Ukrainian Greek Catholic Bishop in Canada, M. Budka.
- ▶ There are unique Ukrainian folk musical instruments in the collection such as a duda, trembita and lira.
- ▶ There is a collection of Ukrainian Canadian military memorabilia.
- ▶ The art collection includes over 400 pieces of art in a variety of styles and media, including 160 paintings of churches in Alberta by Edmontonian P. Iwanec.

## Archives

- ▶ UCAMA is actively involved in the collection of Ukrainian Canadian documents of historical value in Alberta.
- ▶ UCAMA has over 5,000 photographs depicting the Ukrainian Canadian experience in Alberta.



- ▶ The archives holds approximately 300 maps including a number of rare maps printed in Ukraine between 1917-1920.
- ▶ The archives has a significant collection of posters announcing Ukrainian Canadian events.

## Library

- ▶ The library includes over 40,000 volumes.
- ▶ The library contains rare publications from Canada and Ukraine from the late 19th and first half of the twentieth centuries.
- ▶ The library holds a collection of 320 newspaper titles from 17 countries.
- ▶ The library contains an extensive selection of Ukrainian-Canadian almanacs from the early twentieth century.
